




## Year 6 Newsletter Term 2

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We are delighted to announce our topic this term is 'Above and Beyond' focusing on Refugees!

### Reading

Here at Skegness Junior Academy, we have a strong belief that reading is the key to a successful future. Please ensure that your child is reading at home at least 4 times per week, it is important that you inform your child's class teacher via our new lines of communication: Class Dojo or Microsoft Teams. Thank you for your continued support.

- In English, we will be producing narratives involving refugee journeys and poetry based on these. We will also be writing a persuasive letter to the Queen. During this topic, we will be reading a range of texts including: The Boy At the Back of the Class by Onjali Q. Rauf, Wisp A Story of Hope by Zana Fraillon, The Arrival by Shaun Tan, The Day War Came by Nicola Davies, The Journey by Francesca Sanna and Illegal by Eoin Colfer.
- Our 'Above and Beyond' theme continues through Science, where we will be investigating electricity and creating our own electrical circuits. We are also excited to be mapping our own refugee journey by comparing human and physical characteristics of LEDCs and MEDCs. We will continue to learn about the Christian faith in RE. In computing, we will be using a range of digital technology to create algorithms.
- In addition to this, we will be learning French, studying the works of Anthony Gormley in Art and Design.
- Furthermore, we will be creating our own wreaths and poetry to remember life during WW1 and WW2 for remembrance week.

### Also happening.....

#### <u>Maths</u>

In Maths, children will continue to work on their number skills for the mathematical operations, building further on their mental and written methods. Children will also continue to develop their reasoning skills and widen their mathematical vocabulary. They will continue to focus on problem solving and SATs style questions in preparation for these in May.
