









Above & Beyond Year 5 Term 2, 2023-24

This Term

We begin our brand new topic titled 'Above and Beyond', which has consistently proven to be one of our most popular topics in year 5. This topic is centred around space and how it links to humanity. We explore the history of space travel, the latest technologies and enjoy delving into searching questions about our place in the universe.

Maths

During this term, Y5 will be working on multiplication and division. We will be looking at vocabulary such as: multiple, factor, product, square number and cube number. This will all then lead towards applying these facts and skills to realworld problems.

Rapid recall of multiplication facts continues to be a high priority and to support at home, we encourage pupils to increase their recall speed using the TT Rockstars program.

Science

We'll be looking at gravity and how it's the weakest fundamental force, yet the most important force in the universe. We'll be learning about the different orbits in our Solar System and the concept of how a day/month/year changes between planets. We've booked a school visit from the planetarium people and are super excited to give the children this experience.

Reading at Home

We are continuing to promote a love of reading across the Academy and would appreciate your support with this, ensuring that you and your child are reading widely and regularly; exposure to a range of different text types will really boost their performance.

We would like home reading to take place at least 3 times a week (the more the better!). Please record home reading on the 'Boom Read' app. If you have any issues logging on, class teachers will be more than happy to support with this, please contact the office to arrange an appointment.

Key Messages

PE days: Mondays will be normal PE for the whole year group. Your child's second PE session will be swimming and a timetable has gone out from the office already via text, regarding which class will be swimming on which day.

English

During this term, Y5 will be working with a range of themed texts with a particular focus on 'Phoenix', by SF Said and the non-fiction text 'Curiosity Rover', by Markus Motum.

The children will be learning the difference between writing formally or informally, as well as how to write persuasively.

We will be practising our neat, cursive handwriting style regularly alongside our spellings.

Our grammar focus will be on the use of high-level vocabulary and skilfully-controlled sentence construction.

Curriculum

In geography, the children will learn how to read maps and navigate using a compass, working with maps, statistics and facts on a larger scale.

In RE we will be moving on to the Five Pillars of Islam and what it means to be a Muslim

In computing, we will be looking at controlling data chips and physical media using programming.

In art we will be studying the architect Norman Foster, looking at examples of his buildings and how to make it as an architect.
