- We will also be exploring and engaging with Darwin's Origin of Species to investigate endangered animals in our Evolution and Inheritance unit in Science
- Our Traditional Tales theme continues throughout the wider curriculum inspiring our musical composition studies and theatrical DT project. In RE we are continuing our 'Life Journey' studies, discussing and learning about what people believe globally. We will continue to develop our speaking and listening skills in French focusing on moving around Paris. Crime and punishment is our fascinating focus in History this term.

In Maths, children will continue to work on their number skills for the mathematical operations, building further on their mental and written methods. Children will also continue to develop their reasoning skills and widen their mathematical vocabulary.
