<u>Maths</u>

In Maths, children will continue to work on their number skills for the mathematical operations, building further on their mental and written methods. Children will also continue to develop their reasoning skills and widen their mathematical vocabulary. They will continue to focus on problem solving and SATs style questions in preparation for these in May. Furthermore, TTRS is a great program to use at home for practising these skills.

English

Science

In science we will be investigating classification, where we will be studying a range of animals and plants. We will also by developing our learning by investigating statistics and presenting our data in a range of different mathematical ways.
